Home Learning - Seesaw

School Meals

Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are ordinarily entitled to a free school dinner under the Universal Free School Meals initiative when school is open. This is for all children, regardless of family income. Now we are closed, families who qualify for Free School Meals due to low family income and eligibility for certain benefits are being emailed Tesco vouchers to the value of the school dinner. Special mention of **Nadia in 6C** for great geography work locating where her food comes from.




RH- Theo- for being creative and making a great space ship!

2M- Madhvendra- a detailed homemade Chinese dragon




2S- Alexandra for a beautiful cross made from collected flowers.
