End of the Week Letter from Mrs Maynard

Dear Parents and Carers,

We end this week with some sunshine and the prospect of a Bank Holiday tomorrow. I know many of the usual activities that you would normally plan for this kind of day will not be able to happen, but I hope that you are able take some part in marking VE Day, whether it be watching some of the commemoration programmes on TV, making bunting or flags to hang out with your children, or helping them to understand what the day is about – BBC Bitesize will have a number of activities to share.

It is probably timely for us to remember the great sacrifice and bravery that so many people faced during the Second World War, as we are having to make smaller sacrifices for our personal freedom at the moment, and are so grateful to our NHS and key workers for their bravery.

Northampton Diocese have sent forward some prayers for VE Day, I include one here:

O God of truth and justice,

we hold before you those men and women who have died in active service, particularly in the Second World War, whose sacrifice brought Victory in Europe. As we honour their courage and cherish their memory, may we put our faith in your future; for you are the source of life and hope, now and forever. **Amen.**

School Closure

You will be aware of a lot of speculation in the news that Boris Johnson is about to announce the end of lockdown and that schools may re-open. As I write this letter, there has been no official guidance about when schools may re-open. To allow this to happen, a lot of careful consideration will have to be given to pupil and staff safety, as well as that of our parents and wider community, and I have to be absolutely sure that whatever decisions are made can be managed safely. I would ask that all parents continue to work patiently with us. I will communicate any new developments to you as they happen, and will be very clear about how any possible school opening, whether in the near or more distant future, will look like in terms of practical arrangements.

School remains closed.

Letters from School

I am aware that in the weeks that school has been closed, you have received a lot of information from us. In the first few weeks this was to make sure that our families were being kept up to date with all the new information that was coming out from the government, local authority and other sources. I am very aware that this can feel overwhelming at times, and so most information is now put together in one email with a number of attachments so you get one email with all the information you need at the end of the week.

Year 5 Parents - 11+

If your child is in Year 5 and you are intending for them to take the 11+ school transfer test in the Autumn, please read the guidance from the Slough Schools Consortium that has been sent out today. Due to lockdown, the process of registering will be done online within a set timeframe. Please read the letter carefully and make a note of the relevant dates.

Wellbeing Calls

Staff are continuing to make our contact wellbeing calls to families, as are many primary schools. These are primarily to let you know we are still working for our pupils, to give you the opportunity to ask for help accessing the work and to let us know how your children are coping. The lists have been allocated across a range of staff so your call may come from the class teacher or another member of staff. I'm very pleased to hear that most families are coping as well as can be expected, but if you are under pressure, or need some help with school work or signposting to another agency for support, you can speak to school staff in confidence.

Tiktok

Tiktop videos are not appropriate for children to send to staff on Seesaw. Tiktok requires that users be at least 13 years old to use the app. Anyone under the age of 18 must have parental approval to use it, therefore it is not suitable for using to return class work. Please monitor your child's use of technology very carefully.
